When we work together and help one another, we accomplish our goals much faster and with less stress."






















Father's Day — Sunday, June 16th.

Did you know that Father's Day didn't become a federal holiday until 1972, when President Nixon signed it into law? Six years earlier, in 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson had designated the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. This proclamation came almost 58 years after the first event honoring fathers, a Sunday sermon on July 5, 1908, at a church in West Virginia. The sermon was held in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah. However, this was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.
















June 19, 1865.

Juneteenth is also referred to as Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, Jubilee Day and Liberation Day. Juneteenth National Independence Day is the first federal holiday established since Martin Luther King Jr. Day in 1983 and is at least the 11th federal holiday recognized by the US federal government. More than half of the states recognize Juneteenth as a paid state holiday, and all states have some recognition or observance, according to the Pew Research Center. Former Texas state representative AI Edwards was known as the "father of Juneteenth." Edwards sponsored the bill that made Juneteenth a state holiday in 1980.





By the Numbers

Before the Civil War, it was legal in 15 states to enslave people: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia.



Hiking the Anne U. White Trail

30.2 percent of the 1860 population of Texas was comprised of enslaved people, or "bondsmen."


There were 47,030,856 Black or African American people (one race alone or in combination) in the United States in 2021, according to the most recent Census Bureau estimate.














