


Daylight Saving Time Ends

Daylight Saving Time end on Sunday, November 5th. During this time, we "fall" back one hour setting your clocks 1 hour behind. So, on this weekend, you get to



Not all U.S. states practice daylight saving time. Hawaii and Arizona are on permanent standard time, as are Guam, American Samoa, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Did you also know that Germany was the first country to implement daylight saving time? Germany implemented daylight saving time in 1916 to save fuel during World War I. The United States adopted the practice in 1918, but daylight saving time wasn't standardized across the country until the passage of the 1966 Uniform Time Act, which gave the federal government oversight over the time change. 

- · Turkey consumption has increased 104% since 1970.
- Since 1970, turkey production in the United States has increased nearly 110%.
- In 2013, 242 million turkeys are expected to be raised in the United States.
- In 2012, 253,500,000 turkeys were produced in the United States.
- The turkey industry employs 20,000 to 25,000 persons in the United States.
- In 1970, 50% of all turkey consumed was during the holidays, now just 29% of all turkey consumed is during the holidays as more turkey is eaten year-round.
- In 2012, turkey was the # 4 protein choice for American consumers behind chicken, beef and pork
- The top three turkey products sold in 2011 were whole birds, ground turkey and cooked white meat (deli meat).
- Turkey hens are usually sold as whole birds. Toms are processed into turkey sausage, turkey franks, tenderloins, cutlets and deli meats.
- In 2011, 47.4% of turkeys were sold to grocery stores and other retail outlets, 30% sold in commodity outlets, 15.5% sold to foodservice outlets and 6.2% were exported.

Important dates

November 1: Open Enrollment starts for health coverage for the next plan year — first day you can enroll in, re-enroll in, or change health plans through the Health Insurance Marketplace®. Coverage can start as soon as January 1.

December 15: Last day to enroll in or change plans for coverage to start January 1.

January 1: Coverage starts for those who enroll in or change plans by December 15 and pay their first premium. January 15: Open Enrollment ends — last day to enroll in or change health plans for the year. After this date, you can enroll in or change plans only if you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.

February 1: Coverage starts for those who enroll in or change plans December 16 through January 15 and pay their first premium.





- · Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), or based on estimated household income.
















