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


















Mother's Day — Sunday, May 11th

Fun Facts

Meteorological and astrological summer.

There are actually two official ways to mark the start of summer: meteorological and astrological. Meteorological summer begins on June 1st and is based on the calendar and annual temperature cycles. It neatly divides the year into four seasons—each lasting exactly three months-making it useful for weather tracking and climate statistics. Astrological summer, on the other hand, kicks off with the summer solstice, which usually falls around June 20th or 21st in the Northern Hemisphere. This is the longest day of the year, when the sun reaches its highest point in the sky, and it's been celebrated for centuries as the true arrival of summer. Then there's Memorial Day, observed on the last Monday in May. While its primary purpose is to honor the U.S. military personnel who died in service, it's also widely considered the unofficial start to summer in American culture. Backyard barbecues,

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














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Family Arts Bash!























Hands of Love!
