## Under Utilized hours

As the end of the year approaches, now is a good time to check if you have unused hours from your provider. Insurance authorizes therapy hours for use over a 3 to 6-month period. Any unused hours could be a signal to your insurance provider that your child doesn't need all the hours that were authorized. And because of that, when you request hours the next time, fewer hours may be approved. Unused hours typically occur when your child misses therapy, because of illness, vacations, or the holidays. Whatever the reason, we can reallocate missed therapy hours, and make sure you've used all the hours your insurance provider has authorized.

Social skills play a crucial role for children with autism, helping them engage, communicate, and form meaningful friendships. That's why we host Social Saturdays at The Behavior Exchange! These fun and structured sessions give kids the opportunity to practice and enhance their social skills in a welcoming environment. A blend of Mesoamerican ritual, European religion and Spanish culture, the holiday is celebrated each year from October 31-November 2. According to tradition, the gates of heaven are opened at midnight on October 31 and the spirits of children can rejoin their families for 24 hours. ### Fun Facts about this holiday:

- Historical Roots: Day of the Dead originates from pre-Columbian Mesoamerican beliefs, viewing death as a natural, cyclical part of life. Today, it's a joyful celebration honoring the deceased through storytelling, music, and dance, with practices ranging from visiting gravesites to family feasts.
- Ofrendas: Altars are created as portals for the dead to visit, adorned with photos, candles, and symbols of water, earth, fire, and air. Some include Catholic elements like crosses and rosaries, blending indigenous and Catholic traditions.
- Food Offerings: Food plays a significant role on the ofrenda, with items like Pan de Muerto and sugar skulls symbolizing life and remembrance. Loved ones' favorite dishes show ongoing care for those who've passed.
- Marigold Pathway: Bright marigolds guide the souls of the dead, with their color and scent symbolizing the beauty and transience of life.
- Global Celebration: While Mexican in origin, Day of the Dead is celebrated in many countries, each adding unique traditions, from coca leaves in Bolivia to



# Secure ABA therapy coverage in 2025!

**Renew your Health Insurance Marketplace plan during open enrollment, starting November 1st!**

If you currently have a plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace, now's the time to renew your policy and secure continued ABA therapy coverage for 2025.

## Does your employer's plan exclude ABA therapy services?

Consider a Child-Only policy through the Marketplace for ABA coverage in the new year!



Open enrollment starts.

Enroll by December 15, 2024 for coverage that starts January 1, 2025.

Enroll by January 15, 2025 for coverage that starts February 1, 2025.

### Important dates

**November 1:** Open Enrollment starts for health coverage for the next plan year — first day you can enroll in, re-enroll in, or change health plans through the Health Insurance Marketplace®. Coverage can start as soon as January 1.

**December 15:** Last day to enroll in or change plans for coverage to start January 1.

**January 1:** Coverage starts for those who enroll in or change plans by December 15 and pay their first premium.

**January 15:** Open Enrollment ends — last day to enroll in or change health plans for the year. After this date, you can enroll in or change plans only if you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.

**February 1:** Coverage starts for those who enroll in or change plans December 16 through January 15 and pay their first premium.

### DID YOU KNOW?

You can get health coverage for the rest of the year if you qualify for:

- A Special Enrollment Period due to a recent life event, like losing other coverage, moving, getting married, or having a baby.
- Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), or based on estimated household income.





